



Dear Prospective Supporter,

You are invited to attend the 10th Annual Rylie's Angels A-T Golf Tournament and Dinner Reception (www.atcp.org/RahallGolf) in association with the A-T Children's Project, which will be held at Dove Canyon Country Club on Monday, June 6, 2022. We are so grateful to be able to hold our golf tournament and dinner reception again in 2022, and we appreciate the past participants, sponsors, donors and volunteers who have continued to make the tournament possible.

Ten years ago, Rylie Rahall, our sweet, twelve-year old angel was diagnosed with ataxia- telangiectasia or A-T, a rare genetic disease. A-T combines the worst symptoms of muscular dystrophy, cerebral palsy, cystic fibrosis, immune deficiencies, and cancer. A-T usually attacks in early childhood and is degenerative, affecting the immune system, nervous system, and brain; and children with A-T are predisposed to fatal cancers, like leukemia and lymphoma. Children with A-T usually rely on wheelchairs for mobility by age 10 and often do not survive their teens. We are racing against time to save our precious Rylie from the life-altering effects of A-T, and we need your help. Rylie is thriving in her first year of middle school, with the assistance of her one-on-one aide Miss Maureen, her power wheelchair named "Quickie", and her new manual wheelchair named "Cotton Candy" or "CC", because of its bright pink color. Rylie continues to enjoy camping, swimming, art, getting her nails done, learning new languages and trying new sushi restaurants with her family and amazing group of friends.

Because A-T is a multi-system disease, scientists believe that A-T research will help more prevalent diseases such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, AIDS, and cancer. The A-T Children's Project will utilize a portion of the funds raised from the tournament toward continuing the gene therapy approach called "antisense oligonucleotide" or "ASO" therapy, which was approved by the FDA in December 2019 to be used in a child with A-T. This approach has been tested in a lab and has shown that it produces the functional ATM protein that is missing within the cells of children with A-T! In January 2020, for the first time ever, a two-year-old A-T child received the ASO therapy! Physicians and researchers will continue to analyze whether the child is producing the functional ATM protein that is missing within her cells. This treatment will pave the way for other gene therapy approaches – to be used in other A-T children, including Rylie, with the goal of identifying a CURE designed to treat ALL A-T children. There are a host of other promising research activities and clinical trials which our fundraising will contribute to and that we will discuss in further detail at the tournament. We have wanted nothing more than to give our daughter the chance to live a long, full life, not one that could be cut dramatically short because of faulty genes.

Please join our family as one of Rylie's Angels and help give our extraordinary daughter and others with A-T a chance to live a longer, better life.
